Criminal Justice and Prison Reform Committee Judith Brink 482-2029	The Criminal Justice and Prison Reform Committee functions to inform the congregation, the public, and our government about the need to reform our criminal justice and prison systems, and offers ways to provide support for people who are subjected to harmful policies.

Earth Spirits (CUUPS) Betsey Miller 869-0739	Regional chapter of the Covenant of Unitarian Universalist Pagans (CUUPS). Fosters healing relationships with the Earth through creative use of ritual and by promoting an appreciation for Earth or nature-centered religious perspectives.
Endowment Trust Reese Satin 767-3509	Manages gifts and bequests to the Society and distributes grants from income generated by the trust's principal in furtherance of FUUSA's purposes.
Finance Committee Steve Moskowicz 439-6347	Develops and implements financial policies and procedures for FUUSA in conjunction with other committees, councils, and staff.
Flower Committee Sandy Stone 489-8293	Coordinates donations and arrangement of flowers for the sanctuary for Sunday services and, upon request, for special occasions.
Fun(d)raising Chuck Manning 439-4226	The Fun(d) Raising Committee acts as an agent to encourage fun events at FUUSA that will raise funds from both members and non-members. We typically do not sponsor events ourselves, but work with ad hoc groups that are formed for a specific event. We will be concentrating on finding creative uses for our new space.

Sam are working with the Religious Education Council to provide opportunities for members and friends to learn about UU identity and heritage, our Christian and Jewish roots, world religions, anti-oppression work, social justice, and spirituality.
Membership Committee Kathy Hodges 355-5018	Welcomes and provides information to newcomers and to prospective new members during Sunday coffee hour and through sponsored events.
Music Committee Kathy Harris 371-2779	Serves as a support and a resource to the Music Director in developing a high quality music program in the church.
Nominating Committee Chris Jensen 783-9202	Selects nominees for FUUSA's elected personnel and oversees the elections held at the annual meeting. Responds to any special requests from the Board for other nominees.

Refugee Resettlement Project Dick Dana 446-0382	The RRP is tasked with welcoming and supporting an Iraqi refugee family of five, including fundraising, collecting furniture and other household items, hospitality, transportation, and researching options for learning English and getting jobs.
Religious Services Irene Saulsbery 588-6544	Works with the minister to develop and provide religious services that meet the needs of FUUSA and assumes responsibility for those Sundays when the minister is not in the pulpit. Recruits service leaders and ushers for services.
